"Me-First" is best introduced as a story about some people not too much different from the children in the class. No one likes a "Me-First", but a child behaving like a "Me-First" often does not respond to instruction or usual forms of help. "Me-First" is a story with a moral, and the moral is-being first may not always be best.

The story should be introduced after the children are thoroughly familiar with the "Me-First" song. Suggested instruments are listed at the end of the chapter. On the first presentation, the teacher should simply tell the story. On subsequent presentations, children may add the musical instrument sounds. The time for the instrument sound is notated by \_\_ as in Marggle\_\_.

This would make the others made, but they didn't say much. When it was time to take turns getting drinks of water at the water fountain, Marggle\_\_(instrument sound), Mickle\_\_, Moggle\_\_, and Muggle\_\_ would wait patiently. But Me-First\_\_ would push and shove to the front of the line crying:

(Sing the "Me-First" song)
